PAUL'S CAREER

Originally from New Zealand, Paul moved to the UK soon after graduating from the University of Waikato where he majored in psychology and business management.

On his return to New Zealand he took up his first CEO role for the country's largest provider of mental health, addiction and wellbeing services. He spearheaded a massive change programme, requiring the closure of many services and facilities, to establish a broader range of contemporary, community based services. Under his leadership the organisation more than trebled in size.

Recognised for his work he was appointed chairman of the industry peak body and to multiple Government working parties across health, housing and welfare. He also served on a number of expert panels, notably the New Zealand Treasury and Ministry of Business and Innovation's panel to streamline contracting between the Crown and the non-government sector.

In 2012 Paul moved into a dual role with the Wise Group, as one of the Groups Chief Executives and as the Group Director of Strategy. His responsibilities included working with Government Ministers and senior Ministry officials to influence and contribute to social welfare, employment, housing, education, mental health and addiction reform.

Paul says one of the things he remains most inspired by was the opportunity to partner with young people to found Real, a national range of wellbeing and early intervention services for at risk youth.
