Originally a nurse, Gloria held senior nursing appointments in NSW and in QLD and taught nursing administration at the tertiary level, before moving into general health administration. She gained experience at Queensland Treasury and at the Queensland Public Sector Management Commission as a participant in the Australian Public Sector Leadership Program. Subsequent roles included management of the Princess Alexandra Hospital Laundry Project, including the capital development and establishment of commercial functioning and project leadership for implementation of the first Enterprise Agreement in the Brisbane South Region.

Gloria managed human resource policy, advice for the professional development of nursing, medicine and allied health and workforce planning for Queensland Health in her role of State Manager of Organisational Development. She gained extensive industrial relations experience in Enterprise Bargaining (EBA) negotiations and Award negotiation and arbitration. Her health service CEO experience was initially at Toowoomba, where she was appointed to improve budget performance and her Executive team won the Director General's Excellence Award. She was later CEO of Cairns and of the Prince Charles Hospital and Health Service Districts. She was appointed as Deputy Director General of Queensland Health following issues at Bundaberg which resulted in a major restructure and reforms of Queensland Health, after which her major role was the management of the Southern Area Health Service where she led one of the three service delivery Areas for the State. Following her retirement from Queensland Health she undertook locum CEO roles in South Australia at the Royal Adelaide and the Women's and Children's Hospitals Local Health Networks.
