POSITION PURPOSE

The Xavier Speech Pathologist is responsible for working in conjunction with a small multi-disciplinary team to create opportunities for children and young people with complex disabilities while enhancing the lives of their families. They will provide evidence-based services that will enable the client and their family to achieve their goals and promote independence, decision-making, and inclusion in their communities.

Our team of dedicated allied health professionals believes that every child's voice should be heard, be it verbally or non-verbally. That every child should have the opportunity to socialise and make friends through communication and participation at mealtimes. Our Speech Pathologists provide assessments, advice, and support to improve speaking and understanding, non-verbal communication, literacy, eating, drinking, and swallowing. We support children and young people with developmental delay, physical disability, and congenital and genetic conditions.

Our team of allied health professionals are experienced in supporting children and young people with developmental delay, physical disability and congenital and genetic conditions to improve their everyday lives.


